Scholarships

Since 2010, One Young World has worked to guarantee that young people from every country are represented at OYW Summits, regardless of their ability to pay. To ensure this, fully-funded scholarship places are awarded to outstanding young leaders with a range of backgrounds, skill sets and nationalities.

The One Young World Summit is a transformational experience for scholars; accelerating their leadership development, exposing them to innovative solutions they can implement in their own initiatives, and providing them with an unparalleled international network of potential collaborators.

These scholarships are delivered in partnership with global corporations, governments, and civil society. In addition to bringing employees to the Summit, companies will integrate external scholars into the Summit as part of their internal delegations.

It is these young leaders who work outside of big businesses that are critical in making progress on the issues that matter to organisations the most. Whether it's increasing the quality of education, improving financial literacy, expanding healthcare access, or reducing carbon emissions - there is no better way to solve strategic organisational challenges whilst also developing employees, than by connecting talent from around the world. Scholars are often paired with employees in a 'buddy' system that fosters enhanced collaboration to tackle challenges collectively from different perspectives.

Jahnnobi Rahman - Bangladesh Supported by the **Z Zurich Foundation**

Jahnnobi Rahman is the Chief Executive Officer of Relaxy limited. Having experienced severe anxiety herself, she sought to change the lack of self care services for people with personal struggles and broaden the conversation around mental health in Bangladesh by creating the Relaxy app.

Relaxy is a data-driven mental health platform that offers free access to a supportive community and mood-tracking tools. By logging in, uploading your mood, and setting a topic of conversation, Relaxy provides personalised self-care spaces and access to mental well-being services. By subscribing to Relaxy Pro, users are also offered unlimited direct access to counsellors and cognitive-behavioural therapy at rates far cheaper than in-person alternatives. Relaxy makes it possible for everyone to get the help they need, anytime, anywhere

To date, over 80 thousand people have downloaded the Relaxy app. They have helped improve the emotional well-being of over 70 thousand users, transforming 66 per cent of the negative emotions logged on the app into positive ones, and have received 1.8 thousand testimonials. Of these, they are known to have saved 12 lives.

Babatunde Adewumi - Nigeria Supported by AstraZeneca's Young Health Programme

After the loss of his mentor to late-diagnosed cervical cancer. Babatunde saw the devastating impacts that poor education and awareness, financial difficulty, and gender inequalities can have on cancer prognosis for women in Nigeria, where 8,000 women die from cervical cancer annually. This realisation informed his decision to create Quinta Health in 2017 to bridge the gender health gap for women living in underserved communities in Nigeria

Quinta Health is made up of 66 dedicated volunteers who, partnered with state governments and NGOs, are working to establish permanent cervical and breast screening centres with trained nurses and community mobilisers. So far, they have established 60 permanent cervical and breast screening centres across three Nigerian States, training 180 nurses and 249 community mobilisers. Their most notable network is in Gombe, where 11 centres have conducted over 10,000 cervical screenings.

Quinta Health's core touring team has screened 8,600 women for breast and cervical cancer, provided treatment for 787 with cervical dysplasia, as well as administered 500 doses of the HPV vaccine to date. Their work continues to tackle cultural bias and gender inequality in healthcare systems and ensures that no woman is lost to preventable cervical cancer.



Royale Anne Kodio - Mali

Supported by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Orange Corners

Whilst on a school trip to a rural village called Nianfala, Royale witnessed the challenges girls in the village were facing due to period poverty. Without money to afford underwear and no access to safe sanitary products, the girls were forced to stay home from school during the week of their period. They resorted to dangerous and unsafe sanitary techniques to manage them.

Royale was inspired to find a solution and left her job in 2023 to found So'Intim, a social enterprise tackling period poverty and environmental impact through reusable menstrual panties. So'Intim employs young women from underserved communities to create reusable, eco-friendly period panties from locally sourced cotton that can last for up to three years. The profits from online sales go towards making and distributing menstrual hygiene kits for women and girls in rural communities who are living in period poverty. Workshops are also conducted in these communities to educate women and girls on healthy practices to manage their periods with confidence and to reduce absenteeism in schools from periodrelated absence.

So far, So'Intim has disseminated 122 menstrual hygiene kits, enabling 122 girls to stay in school absent-free, and has conducted four workshops to 217 girls and women to combat the stigma of talking about periods and menstrual hygiene. They have also employed eight young women in full time jobs. So'Intim's reusable panties have stopped an estimated 50,000 disposable sanitary pads from entering landfills, saving 700kg of waste to-date.





Lead2030

Each year, One Young World runs our flagship grant-funding programme, Lead2030. Lead2030 is a global initiative that supports young leaders and entrepreneurs working to achieve the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by providing them with the critical financial support and mentorship required to scale their solutions.

Since 2019, Lead2030 has provided \$2.9 million in funding to 57 extraordinary young entrepreneurs tackling complex global challenges with their initiatives.

Send-Off Events

Arranged by the Coordinating and Managing Ambassadors, One Young World organised 28 send-off events around the world to prepare Delegates for their Summit experience and connect them with other young leaders attending the Summit from their respective countries. These send-off events were hosted in 19 countries, and of the 28 Summit send-off events, 18 were in-person events.

Pre-Summit Global Leadership Programme

The Global Leadership Programme is designed to provide Delegates with enhanced and comprehensive leadership skills and principles, alongside expertise around the year's plenary themes. Delegates have the opportunity to find out what to expect from the Summit, how to prepare, and the chance to connect with their peers.

The One Young World Leadership Charter is made up of seven Leadership Principles. Drawing on deep-rooted wisdom from across the world, this Charter stands as a testament to our belief that humanity shares values that resonate across cultures, transcend political barriers, and drive our desire to build a fair and sustainable world, for the benefit of all.

The Global Leadership Programme comprised of a seven-part digital series which was held over the six months leading up to the Summit. Each session included a keynote lecture from an esteemed Counsellor, each recognised as an expert in the Leadership Charters' principles; as well as a presentation from a One Young World Ambassador on how they succesfully embed the principles in their work.

One Young World hosted our inaugural pre-Summit Indigenous Youth Day, for young Indigenous and First Nations leaders attending the Summit. We developed this event in collaboration with the One Young World Indigenous Council, and it brought together Delegates from over 60 Indigenous communities from 30+ countries.

Over the course of the day, attendees participated in panel discussions and workshops covering topics including Environmental Stewardship and Climate Change, Culture and Language, Intergenerational Trauma, and Land, Water and Ocean Rights. Speakers included **Regional Chief Joanna Bernard, Senator Michèle Audette, Kimberly Teehee,** and **Hana-Rawhiti Maipi-Clarke.**




The Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony was hosted at the Bell Centre, the largest ice hockey arena in the world and the home of the Montréal Canadiens of the National Hockey League. We welcomed Counsellors, Delegates and special guests to an evening of sensational entertainment, as well as keynote speeches from renowned leaders.

Hosted by long term One Young World Counsellor Mark Tewksbury and television and radio host Isabelle Racicot, this year's Opening Ceremony showcased young Canadianbased talent from across the creative and artistic industries. Highlights included performances by Notorious Cree, Rupi Kaur, Carpe Diem, Alexander Stewart, and Clay and Friends.

Speakers included Ka'nahsohon Kevin Deer, Director, Indigenous Knowledge Quality Learning and Teaching Excellence, First Nations Technical Institute, Van Zorbas, Chief Culture and People Officer, Deloitte Canada, and Grégoire Baillargeon, President of BMO Quebec and Vice Chair, BMO Capital Markets. The Opening Ceremony keynotes were delivered by Margaret Atwood, David Suzuki, and Sir Bob Geldof.

The Flag Ceremony brought together Delegates from all over the world, highlighting the global scale and impact of the Summit.





Deloitte engages with One Young World each year locally and globally to design and deliver an integrated programme strategy. Since 2022, Deloitte has sponsored the Opening Ceremony as a core element of the partnership. This enables Deloitte to share their message with the One Young World audience and create large scale brand awareness and association in the host city.

Presentation Stage

There were more than 50 Presentation Stage sessions over the course of the Summit. These included keynote speeches, fireside chats, and panel discussions addressing some of the biggest global challenges. These sessions were delivered by Counsellors, guest speakers, Delegates and Ambassadors.

Highlights included:

- Fireside session on how humanity can make AI a force for good with the Prime Minister of Canada, Justin Trudeau and Founder and Scientific Director of Mila, Professor Yoshua Bengio.
- Panel discussion between Maria Ressa, Nobel Peace Prize Laureate, Co-Founder and CEO of Rappler, and Takkawol Karman, Nobel Peace Prize Laureate, Human Rights Activist, Journalist, Politician and Founder of Women Journalists Without Chains, titled Fratelli Tutti/Peace is Possible - Engaging Young Leaders in a Global Movement for Peace.
- Fireside session with Oscar winning actress, **Cher**, and the foremost primatologist of the last century Dame Jane Goodall - chaired by John Simpson, World Affairs Editor at the BBC.
- A special Keynote from Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah, Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan on how young peacebuilders can be supported to deliver lasting peace.



Interactive Stages

We were proud to present a diverse range of content across our three interactive stages - touching on all five of our 2024 plenary challenges, and beyond. These stages give Delegates the opportunity to engage with Counsellors, Delegate Speakers, Delegates, and One Young World Ambassadors, posing questions directly to our expert panellists. Speakers represented every region of the world, a wide array of sectors, and perspectives.

Open Home

The IKEA Open Home stage hosted a wide range of discussion, including a panel on 'Achieving Social Justice in Healthcare Systems', a conversation with Indigenous Creators on TikTok on 'The power of first-person storytelling', and a panel on 'A Global Approach to Combating Hate and Intolerance'.

This year, the IKEA Open Home stage also incorporated an immersive component, allowing the audience to engage with content through a 'silent disco' feature.

Accelerating Impact

Additionally, the JCCM Entrepreneur Zone hosted a live panel with the BBC Global News Podcast, where four One Young World Delegates discussed how global affairs might change if young leaders were in charge.

The Government of Quebec provided invaluable support in making Indigenous Youth Day a success by funding key logistical elements, which allowed One Young World to collaborate with Indigenous suppliers, including event organisers and caterers.

Their funding also supported Fondation Nouveaux Sentiers in bringing a delegation of exceptional Indigenous youth from across Quebec, ensuring their voices were represented at the Summit.

Additionally, the provincial contribution made it possible for the Jeune Chambre de commerce de Montréal (JCCM) to host an Interactive Stage, fostering engagement and connection among young leaders and Summit attendees.

Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs x Orange Corners

In 2024, the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs and their youth entrepreneurship initiative Orange Corners, selected 40 scholars to attend the Summit through the Enterprising Futures Scholarship. These young leaders from Africa and the Middle East work to improve young people's prospects and increase youth engagement in a number of developing countries and fragile states, by supporting local entrepreneurs and job creation.

Enterprising Futures Scholars participated in exclusive pre-programme sessions, organised by One Young World and run by The Next Lab. Each session had a distinct purpose, allowing Scholars to exchange insights about their initiative, and the challenges entrepreneurs commonly encounter. In Montréal, Scholars participated in an additional workshop, specifically designed for the Enterprising Futures Scholarship.

We invited interested and expert Delegates to explore actions and develop ideas within the different Sustainable Development Goals. These networking sessions are designed to give Delegates the space to connect, exchange ideas, and form impactful collaborations.

Following a short introduction by the host and a keynote speech by an expert speaker, conversations were led by Delegates and the session finished with a collaborative exercise to help Delegates build ideas and take action.

We hosted 31 sessions, exploring topics including:

The Z Zurich Foundation also sponsored a Delegate social programme event, which offered them the opportunity to engage with Delegates in an informal and meaningful way.


Holcim

Social Programmes



The programme also featured an address from One Young World Counsellor and 2011 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate **Tawakkol Karman**.
















Montréal City Branding

Accessibility at the Summit

Our aim is to make the Summit accessible to all and help to make Delegates' journeys as smooth as possible between all our venues and throughout the duration of the Summit.

In order to make the Summit as accessible as possible, One Young World implemented the following procedures at the Montréal Summit:

- All One Young World Montréal venues and stages were fully accessible.
- International sign language took place at the Opening Ceremony and on the ٠ Presentation Stage.
- Closed caption text was available on the Presentation Stage and Interactive Stages. ٠
- Height adjustable lecterns on the Presentation Stage.
- A quiet room, male and female prayer rooms and a family feeding room were available at the Palais des Congrès.
- A buddy scheme was provided where requested.
- Personalised accessible transport schedules were provided where requested.

Sustainability at the Summit

Sustainability is a top priority at One Young World and is a core part of our operations. We are committed to playing our part in delivering on the Paris Agreement as rapidly as possible and upholding our ISO20121 Sustainable Events certification. Here are some of the steps that were taken this year:

- The Palais des Congrès was within walking distance of the majority of the other Summit venues and hotels around Montréal.
- · Where car journeys were unavoidable, hybrid/electric vehicles and public transport were recommended.
- Badges and lanyards were made from paper and sustainable cotton.
- In the main exhibition, the stands were manufactured from reuseable materials. All furniture and structures were rented and reused. All carpet was also reuseable.
- All bins at the Palais des Congrès were multipurpose and took recycling, which was then processed and sorted by the venue.
- All catering was locally sourced and provided in recyclable/biodegradable containers with wooden cutlery. Where any food was surplus, this was donated to local food banks.
- Reusable drink bottles were supplied by Pernod Ricard to use at water and refreshment refill stations. Delegates were recommended to bring their own drink bottles and hot beverage cups.
- organic cotton and printed in a renewable energy-powered factory.
- All the Summit venues had sustainability policies which met our strict requirements. this is not met would be removed from the site.
- Delegates were given the opportunity to email the dedicated One Young World sustainability inbox if they spotted anything they would like to change or have any ideas to make the Summit even more sustainable.


