Schengen Visa primer for the One Young **World Summit 2025**

While One Young World will issue detailed visa guidance to all Summit attendees, we wanted to share this essential primer with you as a partner so you understand what to expect from the process.

Who will need a visa to travel to the Summit?

Nationals of 93 countries can travel to Germany to attend the Summit without a visa. A full list of which nationalities require visas and which do not can be found here.

What visa will Delegates from visa required countries need to apply for?

Delegates with passports from visa required countries will need to apply for a Short-stay Schengen visa also known as a Schengen Visa Type C.

When can my Delegates apply for a visa?

In most cases Delegates can apply 6 months before their travel. For most people this will be 2 May 2025.

What is the application process?

After completing registration for the Summit, all Delegates will receive a detailed guide from One Young World on the application process. An overview of the process is as follows:

- Complete a short stay Schengen visa application form
- Book a visa application appointment
- Prepare supporting documents
- Attend the visa application appointment
- Pay the application fee (€90)
- Collect passport with visa from visa application centre

What is the processing time?

After attending a visa application appointment, the standard processing time in most countries is 15 working days. There are however additional steps which add to the overall application process such as the time it takes to prepare an application, the availability of application appointments and the time it takes for stamped passports to be returned. We strongly advise that Delegates begin the application process as soon as they have registered for the Summit.

What support will One Young World provide?

One Young World will provide all Delegates requiring visas with two letters of invitation, one issued by One Young World and one from the City of Munich.


How can I best support my Delegates?

- Encourage Delegates to complete their Summit registration as soon as they have been selected. One Young World can't issue visa guidance or letters of invitation to Delegates until they complete
- Provide a letter of invitation from your company confirming that the Delegate is an employee, that they have been selected to represent the company at the One Young World Summit and that the company is bearing the costs of their visit.
- If using an external supplier such as a travel agent to assist with visa applications, ensure One Young World's full visa guidance is shared with the agent.

Will Delegates need an EITAS?

ETIAS is an electronic travel authorisation and an entry requirement for visa-exempt nationals travelling to Germany and 29 other European countries. ETIAS will start operations until the last quarter of 2026 so will not be required for One Young World Delegates.

Last year's scholarships attracted 70,000+ applications from more than 190 countries and supported 560+ young leaders.




We have a number of scholarships that are currently open and accepting applications, including:

- **Deloitte Scholarship** to identify eight young leaders who are pioneering innovative solutions to either address the causes and effects of climate change and protect natural ecosystems, or transform education and skills development for the future workforce [click here]. Closes 16 April.
- AstraZeneca Young Health Programme Impact Fellowship for young people who are committed to advocacy for health equity in non-communicable diseases prevention or rare diseases. Selected Fellows will receive access to professional training programmes and a grant of either US\$10,000 or US\$50,000 [click here]. Closes 17 April.
- **Z Zurich Foundation Scholarship** for young leaders working on prevention-focused mental well-being projects, adaptation-focused climate resilience projects, or projects enabling social equity through education, employability or entrepreneurship solutions **[click here]**. Closes 1 May.
- The WE Award 2025: Together Against Loneliness, presented by Pernod Ricard - spotlighting the work of five exceptional young people who are promoting social connection and tackling loneliness, cultivating positive social environments and supporting mental wellbeing [click here]. Closes 7 April.

Keithlin Caroo-Afrifa elected Board Director at the Equality Fund

Keithlin, a 2018 All Bar None One Young World Scholar, is the Founder and Executive Director of Helen's Daughters (HD), a nonprofit organisation committed to addressing gender inequity in the agricultural sector, while building the individual and collective capacity of women farmers in the Caribbean region.

She is now starting a new journey as a member of the Board of Directors at Equality Fund, an organisation that has redefined what feminist funding looks like, ensuring that women's rights organizations, particularly in the Global South, have access to flexible, long-term support to drive real change.



Juleah Love launched a film campaign against intimate partner violence

Juleah Love, a 2022 L'Oréal Delegate, is now the Global Head of Brand Corporate Engagement, leading all corporate and sustainability communication, as well as social and environment impact programs at the international level.

She has gained recognition for spearheading and developing Abuse Is Not Love, a global program to prevent intimate partner violence with non-profit partnerships as a part of this initiative Juleah recently released a film titled Don't Call it Love.

A public speaker, Juleah is the official spokesperson for the programme reaching international audiences of over 23 million people across 27 countries.



Daisy Rosales secured a partnership with the State of Rajasthan, India to promote children's wellbeing

Daisy, a 2021 Scholar is the Co-Founder and Executive Director of Brio, a nonprofit that advances global mental health and wellbeing through design and collaboration with local communities.

Through partnership, training, and resource creation, Brio co-creates effective initiatives that resonate in local contexts and scale through local systems.

Since 2018, Brio's collaborative approach has directly helped more than 130,000 people build psychological flexibility.

Brio has now been able to forge a partnership with the State of Rajasthan to integrate children's wellbeing curriculum into all primary schools across the state.
